

CENTENNIAL PROJECT



Happy Easter to you and your families. May you experience the joy and renewal of the Resurrection and the

beauty of Spring!

The 3rd floor renovation project will soon be underway. The last piece needed for commencement is the General Contractor selection. Bids were due on April 6th, and of this Easter date, the choice has likely been made. The next two weeks will be focused on obtaining permits and we anticipate

beginning plumbing mods by mid-month. Other trades will start as needed to facilitate plumbing operations until the full mobilization of all contractors by June 9, 2023.

In other news, St. Joan of Arc School underwent a Middle-States accreditation audit during the week of March 20th. This three-day review occurs every seven years. We are pleased to report that the audit team verbally recommended recertification of our school in their exit meeting on March 23rd. A special note of thanks to admin., faculty, and volunteers who spent countless hours over several years in preparation for this important achievement.

Accreditation, along with our Blue-Ribbon status and S.T.E.M. certification clearly underscore that the academic curriculum at St. Joan is second to none. More importantly, an education at St. Joan is not only academically rigorous, but also grounded in our Catholic faith.

The success of our new school would not be possible without your financial support. Your dollars are an investment in the mission of our Parish, that is, passing on our Catholic heritage to the next generation through education and worship.
