I have a feeling that my Pastor's Column will pretty much be the extent of our parish bulletin for the next couple of weeks! All Masses, devotions, and activities have been suspended because of this Covid-19 pandemic so there won't be much in the way of upcoming events and minister schedules. Let me update as to where we are as of right now.

- Mass will be celebrated Monday through Saturday at 9:00 am and on Sunday at 9:30 am in the Saint Lucy Chapel in the Parish Center. These Masses will be livestreamed via our Facebook page (which can be accessed through our website at stjoanhershey.org) and through our new YouTube channel at St. Joan of Arc Catholic Church. We are using a livestreaming service and the quality of the picture and sound will only get better. Thanks, Father Roth, for being my technician in all things virtual! We have been getting a great response from those who are watching. We welcome comments but please respectful.
- Stations of the Cross will be livestreamed on Fridays during Lent at 7:00 pm.
- Both Masses and devotion being livestreamed are also being recorded so they can be watched at a later date.
- All the Mass intentions for Masses in the parish are being fulfilled by the priests of the parish, albeit privately.
- We have been given directives from Bishop Gainer regarding the celebration of the Sacraments:
 - □ Baptisms may occur but with the fewest participants as possible. It might be best to reschedule at a later date.
 - □ We have one marriage in March and none until June so we are taking care of that.
 - □ Confessions are not to be heard unless there is a danger of death. The same is true for the Sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick. We will let you know as soon as possible if this changes.
 - □ As far as funerals go, if a parishioner dies, we are to have the Graveside committal service as soon as possible with the immediate

family. A Mass for the Dead (Memorial Mass) can be held at a later date.

□ I don't have any information about Holy Week yet, but we are planning ahead to livestream them as well from the chapel.


