From a small congregation of Italian immigrants laboring in the factories of the Hershey Chocolate Company, to the diverse community we have now, Saint Joan of Arc Parish has been building God's Kingdom in Hershey for 100 years.

We have met the needs of a growing parish with the necessary construction (school in 1948, rectory in 1953, convent in 1956, our beautiful church in 1961, and our office and gymnasium additions in 1996) but even more

importantly we have become a parish who has met the spiritual needs of countless thousands through the years. We remember and respect the rich heritage and the dedication of our ancestors, and seek to honor that heritage by continuing to build God's Kingdom here on earth and helping others to know, love, and serve the Lord.

There has been substantial growth in our parish and school in the past few years. Our growing needs in 2019 led us to embark on The Centennial Project capital campaign. We redecorated the first two floors of our school on SandHill Road. Our last project is to make the third floor ready for our estimated 500+ students for the 2022-2023 school year and to finish the renovation of our kitchen and social hall on Areba Avenue.
